2015 has been an interesting year for Sonoran Desert protection, hasn't it?

On the one hand, the Oracle Road wildlife crossings are ahead of schedule and on track to be completely finished in just a few months. Wildlife like javelinas and desert tortoises are already trying to use the wildlife underpass and deer and badgers have been spotted near the wildlife bridge. Because of your support, this threatened wildlife linkage will be re-connected and safer for both people and wildlife.

On the other hand, the results of the November 3rd bond election were extremely disappointing. With your tireless support, we worked hard to champion Proposition 430, which included \$95 million for open space protection. But our efforts were ultimately not enough with the current voting climate and voters rejected all seven bond propositions.

Thank you for being by our side as we celebrate successes and weather challenges together.

The fact is, no matter what, our Sonoran Desert is still under threat from new and expanding roads, new development, threatened water resources, and climate change. And, despite any setbacks, we will continue to work hard every day to protect wildlife, connected open spaces, creeks and streams, and all the amazing places that make up the unique and wild Sonoran Desert.

In 2016, we'll be embarking on some exciting new projects. Your gift will support:

The launch of a new Wildlife Crossing Stewardship Program to ensure the Oracle Road wildlife
crossings are as effective as possible for wildlife. Trained volunteers will regularly monitor the
crossings and we'll be partnering with the Arizona Game and Fish Department to implement a
comprehensive post-construction monitoring program.

- The expansion of our volunteer Wildlife Camera Project to another threatened wildlife linkage between the Tucson and Tortolita Mountains. Interstate 10 is a formidable barrier to wildlife movement and we need to get started now on collecting wildlife presence and diversity data in this area.
- Continued advocacy for Pima County's Multi-Species Habitat Conservation Plan, which will protect endangered and vulnerable wildlife species throughout Pima County. We expect this plan to be finalized in 2016. This will kick off the federal oversight and monitoring of species protection, and we will continue to be involved every step of the way.
- Developing new strategies for open space protection. One of our biggest strengths is leveraging the diverse expertise and perspectives of our member groups (35 groups strong!). With your support, we'll be reflecting on the lessons from the bond election and moving forward to craft new strategies for preserving open space.

Although the bond election results were a major setback, we remain focused on implementing our many, diverse projects and moving forward stronger than ever. With your help, we are committed to being resourceful and creative as we continue to tackle the various challenges facing the Sonoran Desert.
